E. DISCUSSION ITEMS/OTHER:

Summer hour loads

Policy on taking more than 18 credit hours during the year. Need 3.0, and approval to take up to 21 hours. Summer semester maximum determined by the length of the semester. Very few students over the last two years took more than 12 hours. Currently 9 is the maximum, unless approved by their advisor. Southeast Online students get notice from Chelsea asking them to verify they can handle over 6 hours in a four hour period.

Taking more than two courses in a 4-week session, it is very difficult to have enough time to dedicate the class.

Nicholls shared that Southeast online advises 9 hours/week for a 16-week online course. That 9*16=144 hrs. For a 4-week course 144/4 = 36 hrs/week.

Information is in the undergraduate bulletin.

Odegard-Koester advises 9 credit hours for graduate and 12 for undergraduate students.

May need to add some language to the bulletins for summer hours for consistency and for student information.
