Agenda

- New faculty and music chair Nick Kenney was introduced as the Interim Chair of Music. He announced the departments new faculty that include Debra Caldwell, Felipe Brito, and Frank Nawrot. Rhonda provided names of Theatre and Dance new hires. They are Tim Nicolai, Nyghel Byrd, Cathy Voecks, and Lily Blouin. Rhonda also explained that Dr. Michelle Brune is serving as Associate Dean and will be helping with multiple accreditation procedures due this academic year.
- Introduction of Scott and Lisa Blank who assisted with the Marching Band project which has been a wonderful space for the students. There was discussion related to redevelopment in the area that would include a new police substation to offset concerns about safety. Scott presenting police substation renderings that will bring a law enforcement presence to the area. In addition, the City applied for a grant for partial funding of the substation and that has been approved. The substation should be up and running in 2024. Danielle talked about her personal perspective of having a student at St Mary's and the positive improvement this will be in the community.
- Art and Design events presented by Nancy Palmeri posters provided to everyone which
 included events for the fall semester. In addition, Nancy talked about the ways the Arts Buildings
 are being utilized. Some of these include an upcoming welcome back picnic for students and in
 November, a Turkey Feast. These buildings that house ceramics, art galleries, and painting and
 drawing spaces, have created community attention.
- Ticket Sales Update presented by Ellen Wood provided handouts by package type. It
 includes all inclusive packaging. Sales are encouraging with projected increase of 10 to 20% for
 this year.
- **Upcoming Productions** new faculty Debra Caldwell recital, Symphony Sampler which is free and presented as an educational opportunity to hear and see all instruments individually. In addition, 'Head over Heels' is the first musical of the year. The Gala Season Opener and first Jazz concert is coming up along with Big Band Holiday Jukebox. The Holiday Percussion has been remade into a Halloween concert and will be free; come in costume.
- **Update related to the Lanford Wilson New American Play Festival** this year's is called, Our Play and will be in the spring. Concord Publishing picked up Wintergarten.

• Talked about getting Art and Design areas down to the River Campus. They worked off of a master plan from 2011. They noticed this area was prime for re-development.
