## Bachelor of Music Education (BME)

The time it takes to earn a degree will vary based on several factors such as dual enrollment, remediation, and summer enrollment. Students will meet with an academic advisor each semester and use Degree Works to monitor their individual progress.

### SAMPLE FOUR-YEAR PLAN

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### A "Milestone" signifies a significant stage for a student in the completion of a degree.

A minimum 3.00 GPA in the major and overall are required to graduate with a BM degree.

### ADMISSION TO THE TEACHER PREPARATION PROGRAM

To be eligible for enrollment in the majority of courses offered by the Teacher Preparation Program and required for a teaching degree (BSE, BSFCSE, BME), students must be admitted to the Teacher Preparation Program (TPP). Applications can be found at https://semo.edu/college artments/education-health/educator-preparation/admission.html. Students should apply for admission

to the TPP upon having met the following entrance criteria: 1

- 42 hours of coursework completed. 2
- Have a GPA of 2.75 or higher.
  - a. Individual that are below a 2.75, they can meet with the Associate Dean to appeal for provisional admission to the Teacher Preparation Program.
  - If the individual is granted admission, they will have to: b.
    - i. Work with the Associate Dean on a plan to improve their GPA to meet the requirements for graduation/certification.
    - Will be provide a list of support services to help in the process of improving their GPA.

OR

Have a previous four-year degree from an accredited college/university or an associate degree from an accredited two-year college.

- The following course requirements met:
  - A minimum grade of 'C' in CF/PY120 The Child (Elementary, Early, and Exceptional) a.
  - or PY222 Psychological Development in Adolescence (Middle and Secondary) A minimum grade of 'B' in ED280 Introduction to Education as a Profession or h ME222 Principles of Teaching Music.
- International students must also have a minimum IELTS score of 7.0, TOEFL score of 95, PTE 4. score of 64, or Duolingo score of 125. This requirement is for non-United States citizens who are not native English speakers. Students from countries where English is known to be the official language of education are exempt from English proficiency verification.

#### RETENTION IN THE TEACHER PREPARATION PROGRAM

- After admission, students must continue to meet the following requirements for retention in the TPP: Demonstrate continued eligibility for interaction with schoolchildren by completing an MSHP/FBI 1. background check through the use of the MSHP/FBI background check system. (A current
- background check is required for participation in all field and clinical experiences.); 2 Pass all professional education courses with a minimum grade of 'C.' A minimum grade of 'C' must be obtained in all prerequisite courses before a student can be enrolled in subsequent coursework. Students who, after two attempts, have still not earned a minimum grade of 'C' in a particular professional education course will be removed from the Teacher Preparation Program.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENT - A final 3.0 GPA in both pedagogy and content coursework is required for graduation.

#### TEACHER CERTIFICATION

Upon completion of Southeast's Teacher Preparation Program an individual is eligible to be recommended for a Missouri Teaching Certificate if the student has the following:

- A final 3.0 GPA in both pedagogy and content coursework; 1
- A passing score on the appropriate licensure exam(s) as required by the Missouri Department of 2. Elementary and Secondary Education;
- A passing score on the Teacher Candidate Instrument of the Missouri Educator Evaluation System; 3. 4 MSHP/FBI background clearance from no earlier than one year prior to the date of the application for certification

ADDITIONAL NOTES: Regardless of printed program requirements, any changes or additions mandated by the State of Missouri will become effective on the date cited by the regulations. Students transferring into education programs should be aware of the need to be eligible for admission to

the teacher preparation program immediately upon transfer. They should contact the Candidate Status and Certification Officer well in advance of the time of transfer. It is especially important that transfer

students make arrangements for having ACT and/or MoGEA scores transferred to the University .
